

**ST. PETER THE FISHERMAN  
PASTORAL COUNCIL MINUTES  
FEBRUARY 21, 2019**

**Call to Order:** Pat Gagnon called the meeting to order with a prayer at 6:30 p.m. The agenda was approved.

**Minutes:** Corrections to the minutes were made as follows: The budget expenses for the weekly offering should be adjusted to less than \$17,000. St. Peter the Fisherman will be paying \$171,584 to Roncalli for the 2019-2020 school year. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Joe Schepper and seconded by Star Kilarski.

**Old Business:** Father Tom met with Father Doug and John Stelzer to discuss the payment St. Peter the Fisherman was making to St. Francis of Assisi for students attending their school. SPFCC pays for 17 students attending St. Francis. We do not pay for any student whose family are not parishioners of SPFCC.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**Education:** There will be a Change Our World Feasibility Study, initiated by Bishop Richen, to form recommendations for a regional Catholic School System. It is to be finished by May. SPFCC and St. Francis of Assisi have also hired a study to be done. The cost of a new regional catholic school is projected at \$18 to \$20 million. The Bishop's Capital Campaign in the Green Bay Diocese will be conducted before a new catholic school can be started.

**Worship:** There will be a parish mission in March. A new book written by Matthew Kelley will be available for parishioners to read. There will be a retreat for women in May. Vespers will be on Tuesday evenings during lent.

**Stewardship:** No report

**Vocation:** No report

**Building and Grounds:** Repairs in the kitchen that the Ladies of SPCC have requested will cost approximately \$500. A door in Father Tom's house needs to be taken care of, also two doors in the convent. There are water problems from the eaves in the church and the drainage from them. There is still a problem with the floor joint in the link. Joe Schepper will see what can be done to fix the problems. Work on the new heating system for Marian hall has not begun.

**Catholic Men's Organization:** No report

**Catholic Women's Organization:** No report

**Personnel:** Dawn Boren is doing a great job. She is reaching out to more people.

**Finance:** Large donations at the end of the year helped pay the bills. We have already taken out \$50,000 from our investments for the year 2019.

**PASTOR'S REPORT:** The staff is great. The crucifix will come when it is done. An engineer will be in charge of erecting the crucifix

**NEW BUSINESS:** Sunday Supper will be on May 5<sup>th</sup>. Ellen Gelhar will co-ordinate the supper. Pastoral council members will donate cash and desserts for the meal.

**COMMUNITY CLIMATE:** Construction of the Cobblestone Creek Inn should begin this construction season. Public and private money is being used to finance the inn. It will have the design of the Chippewa Falls Cobblestone Inn. It should be completed by Memorial Day 2020. There are no new developments on the Hamilton property. The city purchased the remainder of the Eggers property. Snow removal by the city personnel has resulted in lots of overtime work for full and part time workers. There are three city council seats to be filled on the April 2 election ballot. Utilities, sewers and laterals, street paving are all in varying stages in the new sub- division. 15 or 16 lots will be available.

A motion to adjourn was made by Tim Schroeder and seconded by Steve Becker.
